Route

Metro Getting to Boost from Amsterdam Central Station is fastest by taking the metro (line 51, 53, 54) to Wibautstraat. From there, it is a 2 minute walk.

Train When arriving from Muiderpoort Station, take bus 37 towards Amstel station and get out at bus stop Krugerplein. From there it will be a 5 minutes walk.

Tram From Muiderpoort Station, it is also possible to take tram 3 towards Westerpark and get out at Wibautstraat. From there it will be a 10 minutes walk.


<u>Route</u>

Train The fastest way to get to Framer Framed from Amsterdam Central Station is by train to Muiderpoort Station. The Sprinter from Rotterdam Central also stops at Muiderpoort Station. From there it is about a 7 minute walk. You can buy a train ticket on the station, or through the NS app. **Bus** Framer Framed can also be reached by tram 19 and bus 41; get off at the Oostpoort stop. **Car**, you can park at Q-Park Oostpoort.

Public transport app

Besides Google Maps, '9292' is a handy public transport app (https://9292.nl/) that shows connecting trains, metros, trams, buses and walking routes in and outside the city. It is also possible to buy an e-ticket through this app.
